PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear parents and caregivers,

Lots of great learning is happening at our school. Over the last two weeks I have had the pleasure of visiting each of the rooms to see some of the teaching and learning occurring. Our teachers are highly trained and take

great time and effort to create learning environments to enhance the outcomes of the students at Parramatta. Parents often ask me what they can do to help their child at school academically and socially. The best way for your child to improve at school is to do two simple things. The first one is to read with your child at home even if it's just 10 minutes and the second point is to send your child to school every day so the teachers can support them.

This Friday we have the Chief Scientist visiting our school to check out the outstanding work our students are doing in STEM and Technology. Many families don't realise that at Parramatta we have a special technology program where students are learning robotics, programming and design and creation aspects. Mrs Brolese's program is highly sought after and loved by all students involved.



Lastly, as we get closer to the end of the term we start to process our 2023 enrolments. Since my arrival at Parramatta at the beginning of 2020, the school has grown from 309 students to almost 420 in just over two years. We are predicting around 430 in 2023 and over 450 for 2024. This growth will see future improvements to our facilities. Mid Term 4 we will see a \$750,000 upgrade to F and A block creating 4 new state-of-the-art classrooms for our students. SCHOOL DAY TIMES

Parents/carers are reminded that our school day is 8:30am to 2:30pm. Unless your child/children are attending after school programs all students are to be off school grounds by 2:45pm. This is when the gates get locked and our staff ensure all children have made their way off school grounds safely.

A reminder to parents/carers to keep your child's toys, collectables and valuable items such as jewellery or devices at home. School staff have found that when these are brought to school they are often lost, damaged or go missing and students can become upset by these circumstances. It also ensures we can limit distractions from the program of learning. Thank you for your support with this.

PREP 2023

We are currently taking Prep enrolments for 2023. All current families who will have a child coming to Prep next year must complete an enrolment form. Enrolment forms can be obtained from the school office. When they are completed they need to be brought back to the office along with the original birth certificate of the child. A short interview will be held with each new enrolment. Getting in early will save you time next year. Our school has had a 20% increase in enrolments over the last year so it is important to get in early to secure your spot. In 2023 we are estimating 60 new Preps.



TRANSITIONS TO YEAR 7 IN 2023

While it feels like 2023 is far away, high schools are already preparing for next year's intake. If you have a child in Year 6 make sure that you have contacted your feeder high school. The two main high schools that Parramatta students feed into are Trinity Bay State High school and Cairns State High School. Please contact these schools for enrolment information.
