Parramatta State School will receive

\$301, 220*

This funding will be used to

- Increase academic achievement in English and Mathematics to 80% A-C (baseline) to 2022 (endpoint).
- Increase student engagement and Indigenous Attendance in P-6 to 85% in 2022.
- Increase student engagement and reduce the % of disciplinary absences for students in care by 50% from 2021.

Our initiatives include

- Collaborative planning and unpacking the Australian Curriculum, including capability development for teachers in the Australian Curriculum and General Capabilities, Student Diversity and Cross Curriculum Priorities.
- Building teacher and leadership capability of student performance data to inform curriculum planning and delivery process to support inclusion and differentiation of the curriculum with a strong focus on reading and maths.
- Building teacher and leadership team capability on delivering Explicit Teaching Coaching.
- Employment of a Technology/STEM teacher to help support students understanding into digital technologies and STEM.
- Targeted strategies to support Response to Intervention and curriculum differentiation Tiers 1-3.
- Increased student engagement in curriculum and attendance through Positive Behaviours for Learning, social skilling support and whole school well-being.
- Improve the capability of teachers understanding of Maths focusing on Problem Solving and the Number strand.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employment of Deputy Principal (\$160,000)
- Employment of Community Liaison Officer (\$35,220)
- Employment of Technology Teacher to release staff for collocative planning (\$80,000)
- Employment of a Behaviour Support Teacher to support kids in care with their ongoing learning (\$26,000)
